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

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The FHN Nurse Residency Program emphasizes critical thinking skills, incorporates research-based practice, patient safety, and professional development. It prepares resident nurses to:

- Care for patients with increasing levels of acuity and complexity
- Develop clinical nursing leadership at point of care
- Improve patient safety and quality of care
- Foster critical thinking skills
- Bring evidence-based practice to all aspects of FHN Nursing
- Strengthen the commitment to the profession of nursing and develop individual career goals

This 12-month program includes monthly seminars with nursing and organization leadership.

TOPICS INCLUDE:

- Stress management and self-care
- Patient care coordination
- Patient and family teaching
- Conflict resolution
- End-of-life care
- Ethical decision making
- Professional development and advancement programs











REQUIREMENTS FOR THE FHN NURSE RESIDENCY PROGRAM

- Hold an associate's, bachelor's, or master's degree in nursing science from an accredited institution
- Hold a current Illinois nursing license
- Participate in all Nurse Residency learning experiences and program components
- Complete program surveys and evaluations
- Complete an individual or group evidence-based practice project

Nurses who accept RN positions at FHN and have less than six months' experience will automatically be placed into the Nurse Residency Program.
